### Introduction

The Painting the Current Picture: A National Report on Treatment Courts in the United States (PCP) project is designed to gather information from coordinators regarding the treatment court programs within their respective jurisdictions. The purpose of this project is to better understand how treatment courts are structured, how they operate, the outcomes produced (e.g., graduation rate), challenges experienced, resources needed, etc. Moreover, these data allow us to determine the number of individuals participating in these programs nationally and identify and monitor trends within the field. This PCP project is being conducted on behalf of the Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA) by the National Drug Court Resource Center (NDCRC), housed at the University of North Carolina Wilmington.
