Introduction

The Painting the Current Picture: A National Report on Treatment Courts in the United States (PCP) project is designed to gather information from state/territory coordinators regarding the treatment court programs within their respective jurisdictions. The purpose of this project is to better understand how treatment courts are structured, how they operate, the outcomes produced (e.g., graduation rate), challenges experienced, resources needed, etc. Moreover, these data allow us to determine the number of individuals participating in these programs nationally and identify and monitor trends within the field. This PCP project is being conducted on behalf of the Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA) by the National Drug Court Resource Center (NDCRC), housed at the University of North Carolina Wilmington.

You will be asked a series of questions regarding the **MENTAL HEALTH/WELLNESS COURT PROGRAMS** within your state/territory. For **each MENTAL HEALTH/WELLNESS COURT PROGRAM**, you will be asked to provide data regarding participants served in calendar year 2022 (January 1, 2022 - December 31, 2022). You will answer the following questions for each of your MENTAL HEALTH/WELLNESS COURT PROGRAMS. For example, if you have 10 operational mental health/wellness court programs in your state/territory, you will provide the following data for each program separately.

Section One:

Provide the total number of individuals served by the **MENTAL HEALTH/WELLNESS COURT PROGRAM** (active), the total number of graduates, and the total number of unsuccessful participants by **gender**, **race** and **ethnicity**, and **age**.

Section Two:

For each listed substance, provide the **total number of individuals** in your **MENTAL HEALTH/WELLNESS COURT PROGRAM** reporting it as their **primary** or **secondary** drug of use.

Section Three:

Indicate the eligible offense types and the plea/sentence structure for your **MENTAL HEALTH/WELLNESS COURT PROGRAM**.

Each block of questions outlined above will appear for the corresponding number of mental health/wellness court programs that are operational in your state/territory.

Your participation in this project is voluntary and poses little risk to you. Your responses will be combined with the answers of other state/territory coordinators in the writing of the *Painting the Current Picture* monograph. Moreover, your name and other identifying information will not be used in the writing of this report. In appreciation for your time and effort, the NDCRC will provide you with a copy of the *Painting the Current Picture* monograph, as well as a summary report of your state/territory's information that includes relevant data from the U.S. Census Bureau, Center for Disease Control & Prevention, SAMHSA's National Survey on Drug Use and Health, & FBI's Uniform Crime Report.




