One of the primary goals of the NTCRC is to ensure accurate and relevant information is available to treatment court practitioners, treatment providers, and other stakeholders.

- The *Drug Court Review* journal is distributed annually; topics and themes reflect areas of interest.
- The NTCRC website houses a repository of sample operational documents and resources organized by court type.

Collaborate.

The NTCRC is a member of the Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA) Training and Technical Assistance Collaborative, which also includes the Center for Justice Innovation, All Rise, National Center for State Courts, and the Tribal Law and Policy Institute.
